



B1 Is Breast Surgery a Money-Losing Enterprise?

Susan Boolbol, MD, Anees Chagpar, MD Delaware Suite A, Lobby Level

In these hard economic times, breast surgeons are facing significant financial challenges. In this session, Drs. Boolbol and Chagpar will discuss the fiscal realities of breast surgery, and innovative potential options for breast surgery to remain financially viable.

B2 New Breast Imaging Modalities

Maxine Jochelson, MD, Lorraine Tafra, MD Washington Room 1, Exhibition Level

What, if any, new technologies can be added to mammography, breast ultrasound, and breast MRI to improve our ability to diagnose, locally stage, and follow patients with breast cancer? Drs. Jochelson and Tafra will discuss new modalities, such as digital tomosynthesis, contrast enhanced mammography, PEM, BSGI, breast CT, and new MRI sequences, such as spectroscopy and diffusion weighted imaging, and what they can and cannot be used for.

B3 Hereditary Breast Cancer

Kevin Hughes, MD, Steven Narod, MD Washington Room 3, Exhibition Level

Women at high risk of hereditary breast cancer will benefit from more aggressive screening, chemoprevention strategies, and prophylactic surgery, potentially decreasing the morbidity and mortality of this disease. Drs. Narod and Hughes will discuss the identification of these women in your practice, the value of genetic testing, and the efficacy of various treatment and prevention strategies.

B4 Ipsilateral Breast Cancer Recurrence: Predictors, Diagnosis, and Management

Judy Boughey, MD, Henry Kuerer, MD, PhD Virginia Suite B, Lobby Level

The incidence of ipsilateral breast cancer recurrence has decreased due to better imaging and improving systemic therapies. Drs. Kuerer and Boughey will review the diagnosis and predictors of breast cancer recurrence and end with a discussion on the management of this entity with a focus on new clinical trials and evidence that mastectomy may not always be indicated.

B5 Complementary and Alternative Therapy in Breast Cancer

Beth DuPree, MD, Debu Tripathy, MD Washington Room 4, Exhibition Level

Complementary and alternative medicine (CAM) is of great interest and used commonly by patients with breast cancer. Modalities ranging from exercise and meditation to homeopathy, herbal medicine, and acupuncture have varying levels of evidence to support or discourage their use. Drs. DuPree and Tripathy will review the data behind commonly used forms of CAM and provide a framework for future research that could integrate some of these approaches into the standard of care to improve patient outcomes.

B6 Breast Screening: Who Gets What— Mammography, Ultrasound, MRI

Wendie Berg, MD, PhD Maryland Suite A, Lobby Level

Addition of MRI or ultrasound to mammography will increase cancer detection in certain subgroups of women and will also increase false positives. Dr. Berg will discuss evolving guidelines and evidence for supplemental screening of women at increased risk for breast cancer.

B7 Defining and Measuring Quality of Care in Breast Surgery

Multiple national quality initiatives addressing the quality of care provided to patients with breast disease have been developed. Information will be provided about the value of these programs, including The American Society of Breast Surgeons' Mastery of Breast Surgery program. Methods to audit and improve quality of care locally, regionally, and nationally will be presented as well.

B8 Adjuvant Therapy for the Surgeon: Who Gets What?

Adjuvant therapy has been evolving—first with the development of hormone therapies, then cytotoxic chemotherapy drugs, and more recently targeted agents. Dr. Hudis will discuss the different indications for adjuvant therapy with particular focus on new emerging therapies and technologies to identify important patient subsets.

B9 Health Care Reform and Its Impact on Breast Surgery

The security requirements for handling personal health information (PHI) as required under the HITECH act will also be highlighted. The financial impact to your practice will be discussed as well.




