

# **Examining Locoregional Control in Early Breast Cancer** 5:30 pm-7:30 pm

This symposium will focus on emerging data regarding treatment decision-making and difficult clinical scenarios relevant to clinicians who provide care to patients with early-stage breast cancer, including ductal carcinoma in situ (DCIS). The scientific agenda will feature plenary lectures and interactive clinical questions utilizing an audience response system. 


