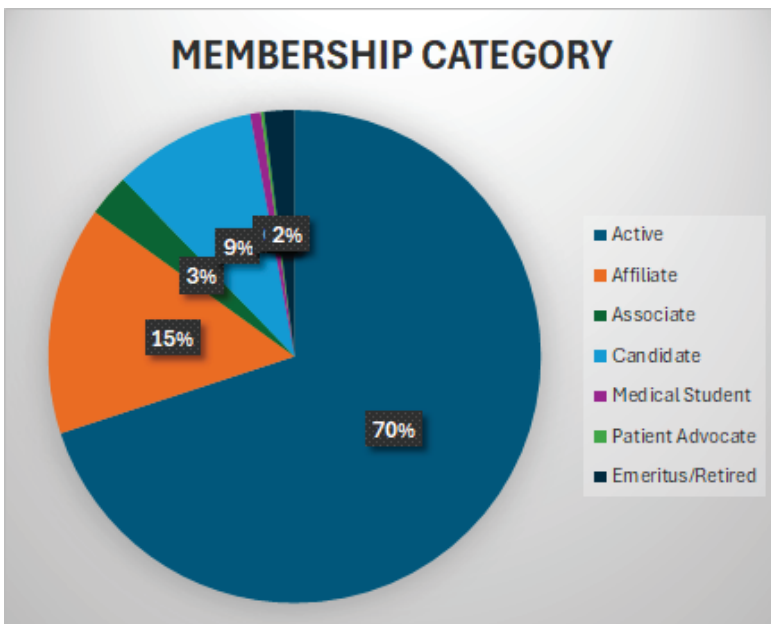

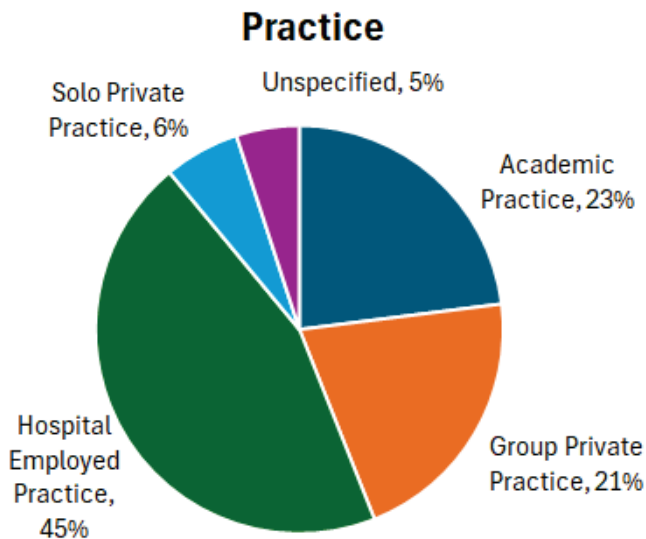

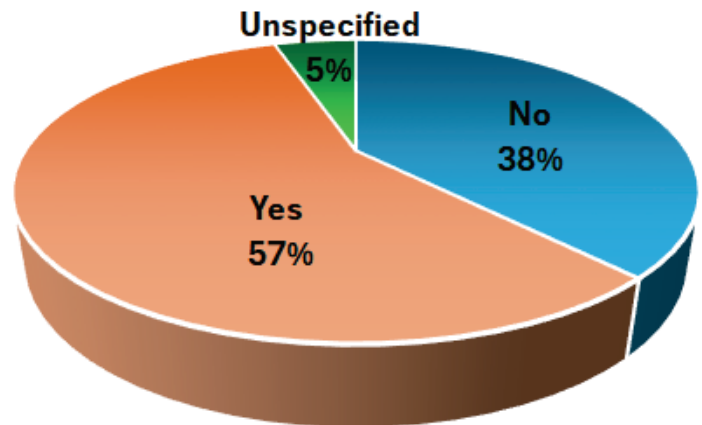

### Question of the Week

Free to all Society members and updated weekly, this web-based questions on several topics where there are gaps in education. This program reaches over 4100 members per week. Participants earn the CME and self-assessment credits necessary to fulfill the American Board of Surgery's Maintenance of Certification part 2 requirements for recertification.

### Advanced Practice Providers (APP) Breast Certification Program

- This program furthers APP education on benign and malignant breast disease.
- The learning modules will have educational lectures and resources followed by self-assessment questions.
  - Over 300 multiple-choice questions will be available to review throughout the course, all of which include critiques with evidence-based explanations for the answers and supporting references from current literature.
- At the completion of the program, participants will complete an online exam with multiple choice questions.
- Statistics: 247 APPs enrolled in the 2023-2024 certification cohort, with 238 passing the certification exam.
- Statistics: 202 APPs enrolled in the 2024-2025 certification cohort with 189 passing the certification exam.
- Statistics: 204 APP's enrolled in the 2025-2026 certification cohort. Testing is going on now through April 30.

### Breast Ultrasound and Stereotactic Breast Procedures Certification and Accreditation Programs

- Encourages education and training to advance expertise and clinical competency for surgeons who use breast imaging technologies in their practices.
- Offers a means for assessment and recognition of the surgeon's training, clinical experience, and quality assurance.
